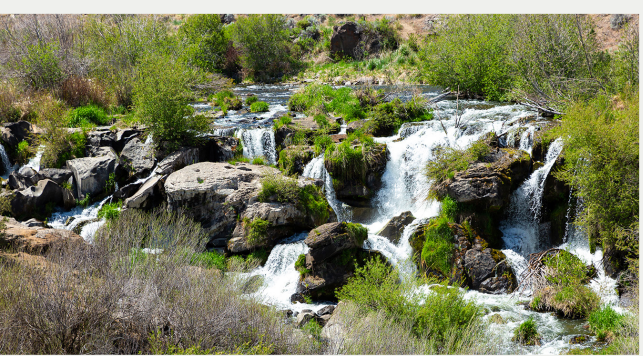




Juniper Preserve & Golf Course, Redmond OR

CLINE FALLS, Redmond OR

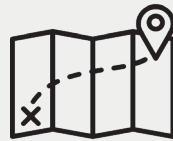
Located 4 miles east of Redmond on the Deschutes River, Cliline Falls State park is a beautiful place to picnic, hike, fish, swim and explore. Walk down the trail and you will see several water falls. There is also a rock climbing site about 100 yards downstream on the east side of the river.



LAVA CAVES, Redmond & Bend OR

Central Oregon is home to many inactive volcanoes and a sprawling system of old lava tubes. The most wellknown caves for tourists to explore include Arnold Ice Cave, Hidden Forest Cave, Lava River Cave, Skylight Cave, Fort Rock Cave, Boyd Cave and Redmond Caves.

An indoor/outdoor Tap House, Event Venue and restaurant with 20 beers on tap, 6 fantastic local food trucks, live music, lots of outdoor seating and a family friendly atmosphere. The Annex hosts local talent and delicious food.

ST FRANCIS McMENAMINS - Restaurant/Hotel/Pub



The Old St. Francis School was transformed from 1936 Catholic schoolhouse to, in 2004, a hotel complete with classrooms-turned-lodging rooms, a pub, brewery, a movie theater, private meeting/event space, live music bookings, and a fantastic soaking pool that beckons day travelers, shoppers, hikers, skiers and outdoor adventurers alike. There is even a secret bar called the Broom Closet!

SMITH ROCK, Redmond OR

Smith Rock is generally considered the birthplace of modern American sport climbing, and is host to cutting-edge climbing routes. The majestic park covers over 650 acres and hovers around 3000 feet in elevation. The major rock faces are welded tuff, or compressed volcanic ash formed 30 million years ago. Whether you come for the climb or come to unwind, you'll see why Smith Rock is one of the 7 Wonders of Oregon.



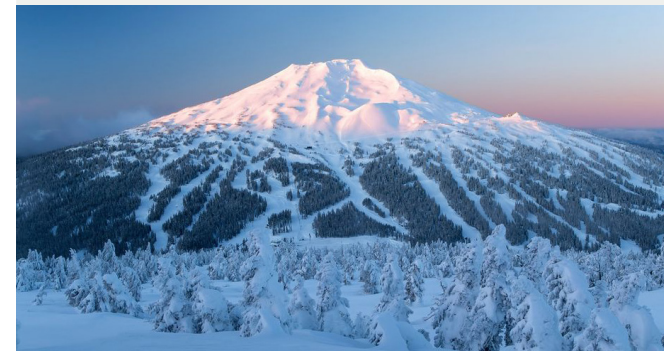
DRAKE PARK, Bend OR

One of Bend's longest standing and best known parks, this popular downtown community gathering place hosts many events throughout the spring, summer and fall. Features include nearly a half mile of riverfront, acres of open lawn, an outdoor stage, restrooms, small picnic tables, river access, trail connections and of course, it's postcard like scenic views.
